The Parish Office is open on: Mon, Weds & Fri. 9.30am - 3.30pm The word 'Lent' is originally derived from Anglo-Saxon words 'Lencten'' which means 'spring', it is a time of growth and new life and it lasts for a period of 40 days. We remember that Moses stayed with the Lord at Mount Sinai for forty days and forty nights in order to receive the Ten Commandments. In these forty days and nights, he did not have food or water at all.

The prophet Elijah walked to the Lord at Mount Sinai, for forty days and nights. And, before commencing his public ministry, Jesus fasted in the desert for forty days and nights. 40 is a very biblical number!

Lent is a time for us to reflect on our lives as Christians. We try to do this in three very practical ways; by paying greater attention to our prayer lives, by trying to live more simply through fasting, abstaining from things which are superfluous to our needs and finally by trying to help others through the practice of Almsgiving.

In our diocese every year the Cardinal makes a special Lenten appeal. He encourages you to make a donation to strengthen marriage and family life, to inspire young people in their faith and to help those in need in our communities. Envelopes in which to make a donation to the Cardinal's Lenten Appeal can be found at the back of the church and there will also be a Lenten Alms Appeal box near the sanctuary in which make you can your donations throughout the season of Lent.
