If you caught an illness, you would see your nearest doctor. And if you needed medicine, you would take a quick trip to the pharmacy to see a pharmacist. If you didn't go to the doctor or pharmacist, who knows what might happen? So imagine if you were sick and the medicine you needed wasn't nearby, but was four hours away. Four hours on foot...when you're sick. This is the reality for countless people around the world who are not able to get to a pharmacist or doctor. They walk miles in the hope that they might get treatment.

Sister Consilia lives in Zimbabwe. When she was a little girl, she caught malaria. She remembers: "It was raining and we had to walk for four hours to get treatment." Thankfully, Sister Consilia survived and she is now a trained pharmacist who treats people with malaria, typhoid and other preventable diseases.

Sister Consilia is just one of the amazing highly-trained, highlyskilled local experts you help around the world through CAFOD. Your donations to CAFOD are like an outstretched arm offering support. And these experts are the hands that reach people living in the most remote places. They might be: Ebola doctors in the Democratic Republic of Congo peace activists in Colombia, or disability rights campaigners in Bangladesh.

Our global family of local experts is on the ground day and night treating people in the most difficult to reach places on earth. But there are many still suffering because we need more trained health workers. Please keep Sister Consilia in your prayers today. And please take some time during Lent to remember the women and men living and working in some of the most dangerous and difficult-to-reach places. They tell us that your thoughts and prayers give them strength to do their work.
